ATTENTION: POTENTIAL POLICE ACADEMY STUDENT

MCOLLES rules regarding medical qualifications to become a licensed law enforcement officer in Michigan state the following:

R28.4102a Medical Selection Qualifications

Rule 2a. A person selected to become law enforcement pursuant to the provisions of this act shall meet all the following medical requirements:

(e) be free from any of the following, which may tend to impair the efficient performance of a law enforcement officer's duties or which might endanger the lives of others or the law enforcement officer:

- (i) Physical defects
- (ii) Chronic diseases
- (iii) Organic diseases
- (iv) Organic or functional conditions
- (v) Medical and emotional instabilities

Therefore, if you suffer from a chronic disease such as diabetes, epilepsy, hepatitis, seizures, heart problems or disease, etc.; take medication for or have been diagnosed with depression, ADHD, schizophrenia or any other mental or emotional disease; or take prescription medication on regular basis for any affliction; or are missing any extremities (fingers, toes, arms or legs), a medical investigation may need to be conducted by MCOLLES staff to determine whether or not you can meet MCOLLES standards.

If any of the above applies to you, you **MUST** contact the academy Training Director (or your recruiter if a police agency is sending you to the academy) and make him/her aware of your situation at the earliest possible date. Failure to so could prevent you from entering the academy.
