Registration Information

Transfer students participate with all current WMU students in online registration. Your opportunity to begin registering for classes is based on the number of hours you have transferred. Frequently Asked Questions

What is my classification?

Classification is determined by WMU hours earned, which includes transfer credit.

Freshman 0-25 semester hours Junior 56-87 semester hours Sophomore 26-55 semester hours Senior 88 or more semester hours

When transfer credit changes classification from freshman/sophomore (lower level) to junior/senior (upper level): Students with earned hour totals of 56 hours or more will be assessed their tuition costs at the upper level tuition rate. This higher tuition rate takes effect at the time of the change in classification, and the difference in tuition cost will be applied to the cost of the student's class schedule in progress at the time of the classification change, resulting in additional charges.

What grade is required for a course to transfer?

No courses with grades less than "C" will transfer. When a course transfers, only credits transfer; grades do not transfer to WMU.

My credit evaluation includes a "Credit by Departmental Recommendation Only" (CBDRO) notation. What should I do?

Contact the appropriate academic department for consideration of credit for any course designated as CBDRO. If credit is granted, the department will notify the Office of Admissions, and you will receive a supplemental credit evaluation.

Will WMU grant credit for my credit by exam?

In order to receive consideration for credit, official score reports of AP or CLEP examination results must be sent to WMU, college code 1902. Scores will be reviewed under the WMU catalog's credit by examination policies.

I have fulfilled the requirements of the MACRAO (Michigan Association of Collegiate Registrars & Admissions Officers) Articulation Agreement. What does that mean?

Transfer students whose transcripts have been appropriately identified and certified as having fulfilled the requirements of the MACRAO agreement by their respective Michigan community colleges will have satisfied WMU's lower level General Education requirements. Students should consult their curriculum advisor in order to determine remaining General Education requirements.

Is there an orientation to WMU for transfer students?

There is the Transfer Transition Program for admitted transfer students entering WMU in the fall and spring semesters. An invitation will be mailed from the Office of Transfer Student Services. Questions? Call (269) 387-0740.
