





ADMISSION

You will receive an acceptance letter within two weeks of completing a free application online at **www.kvcc.edu/apply** and submit supporting documents:

- Financial Certification form & proof of funding
- Proof of English proficiency (61 TOEFL, 6.0 IELTS, 95 Duolingo)
- Copy of passport

NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

Attending orientation is mandatory for all new students. At orientation, you will be introduced to the Kalamazoo Valley campus, register for classes and the services available to you.

TUITION

Tuition bills are available online in My Valley. Pay for your classes online, on campus or by mail during deferred payment periods. Payment plan options are available.

STUDENT ID

Stop by the Student Service Center when the semester begins to pick up a Student ID card needed to use many services. At the Arcadia Commons Campus, it is required for parking validation and door access.

ASSESSMENT

Course prerequisites are enforced at Kalamazoo Valley which requires assessment of your placement level prior to registering for classes. There are three ways you can satisfy this requirement:

- SAT/ACT scores (optional) Kalamazoo Valley accepts ACT
 scores and the new SAT scores
 from tests taken within the
 last two years. Submit your
 scores to Student Development
 Services at development@
 kvcc.edu.
- Placement Test complete the free placement test given on a walk-in basis in our Testing Centers.
- College courses have completed a college level English and/or math class at another institution with a grade of 2.0/C or better, or have earned a bachelor's degree or higher as identified on the Kalamazoo Valley application.
